A S S I G N M E N T

1. Assigned Target: HAUTMESNIL, FRANCE
2. Commitments: The 401st Group was to furnish three 12 A/C boxes for the 94th "B" CBW. One spare was to accompany each box - no PFF A/C.

3. Flight over England:
 - a. Takeoff: Takeoff was as briefed, all ships getting into the air in satisfactory manner.
 - b. Group & Wing Assemblies: Assembled at 10,000 ft. on Cottesmore Bunker between cloud layers. Group and Wing assemblies a little slow due to haze. Wing assembly accomplished before departure time.

MISSION SUMMARY REPORT (Cont)

c. Route to Coast: Route and timing were as briefed. The coast was departed one minute late with three full 12 A/G boxes.

4. Attack:

a. Flight to Target: The 94th "B" CBW flew east of briefed course to avoid cloud formation. Reached friendly coast on time, the Wing then flew slightly west of course to avoid prop wash of 94th "A" Wing, following "A" Wing by about 2 minutes. Turned short of I.P. and flew north of course to target per instructions of Division Air Commander received on VHF. The Scouting Force had suggested that the formations fly either 5 miles south or north of course to avoid a heavy flak area.

b. Bombing Runs:

Lead Box : The target area was badly smoked up due to previous bombing; also the smoke barrage that had been laid down was blown into the target area. A rate and drift line could not be picked up due to smoke rising into the air. As we came upon the target it could be identified but then it was too late to make a good bomb run. Therefore, no bombs were dropped. The Group did not attempt to proceed to the secondary as we would not make contact with our high and low box. Also because of the confusion of other Wings in the area.

High Box:

We turned to the left about 8 miles south of the I.P. and started the bomb run heading straight for the target area. Smoke from the ground artillery and smoke from the bombs of groups that went ahead of us completely covered the target area. This smoke rose to heights of 5 or 6 thousand feet and screened our assigned MPI from view. When we got directly over the smoke we could look down and see the quarry, which was our assigned MPI, lying in the clear just over the smoke. We crossed over just a little to the right of the quarry and continued on the same course for about 2 minutes. We then swung to the right about 45° and then started a slow circle to the left. At the same time we started to descend. We assumed the leader was searching for a target of opportunity, as stated in the Field Order. The turn to the left was about 210° putting us on a heading of 260° . We had received no word from the Air Commander of the box telling us that he was in distress and we saw no flak or fighters come close to him so we assumed he was all right and kept following him. The leader then turned to the right about 90° and levelled out. It looked to us like he was making a bomb run for he stayed straight and level for about 2 minutes. We saw the bombs dropping out of the lead ship so everyone in the formation dropped on his release. The bombs fell just East of Caen on the East Bank of the ORNE River. Immediately after bombs away the leader started a steep dive down and to the right. We realized then that he must be in distress so we let him go on alone and our ship took over the lead of the box.

MISSION SUMMARY REPORT (Cont)

High Box: (Cont) We headed straight north for the coast and cut over the channel. The lead ship continued its very steep dive. Crew members from various ships in the formation claim to have seen between 3 and 4 chutes come out of the ship while it was diving. The ball turret man in our ship saw the plane hit the ground near Caen.

Low Box: Due to heavy smoke the target could not be identified until rather close. Knowing that the bombs could be placed in the target area, as marked on the photo, a 90 degree turn was made to the left. After a 30 second run bombs were away. Bombs were observed to hit on the eastern edge of the target area.

c. Flight from Target: Wing leader brought formation out into Channel and then turned it over to Deputy, due to engine trouble in lead ship. Secondary was not bombed because both High and Low boxes were known to have bombed, but this information on the high box did not reach Wing leader until out in channel. Groups re-assembled quickly, somewhat in trail.

d. Return to Base: Route was as briefed, formation staying west of London. Let down was made through holes in clouds and normal landing accomplished. All returning ships landed safely at home base.

e. Weather: Over England clouds were scattered at 13,000 feet to 14,000 feet; 8/10ths undercast in spots. Over target it was clear. About the same on return.

f. Fighter Support: Area support, very few friendly fighters seen. However, none were needed.

g. Conclusions and Recommendations:

None.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

Lead Box: All A/C did not bomb due to identifications difficulties at target.

High Box: All scheduled A/C attacked the target.

Low Box: A/C 42-97664 - Not Sortie. Returned early because #3 Engine oil return line was leaking badly. Ground check revealed that external prop governor oil supply line flering had cracked.

A/C 44-6313 - Sortie. Bombardier failed to release bombs!

6. Enemy Opposition: No air opposition. Lead ship of High box caught a direct burst of flak near Caen, no other flak was encountered.

10. Bombing Data:

a. Observations:

Lead Box: Bombs not dropped due to smoke and dust covering entire area of target making it unsafe to drop.

High Box: Bombs hit East of Mann, on the East bank of the Orne River.
(see Bombing Run)

Low Box: Bombs were observed to hit on the eastern edge of the target area.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Box: Of the 12 scheduled A/C E.E.T., all did not bomb. Ten returned 370 x 100# M30, two returned 76 x 100# M30. The spare returned its load of 38 bombs.

High Box: Each of the 12 scheduled A/C E.E.T. dropped bombs - 444 x 100# M30 in the target area. One ship had 12 bombs hung up which were returned. The spare returned its load of 38 x 100# M30.

Low Box: Of the 12 A/C E.E.T., 11 dropped 397 bombs on primary target. One bombardier failed to release 38 x 100# M30 and returned them. Two other A/C had a total of 19 bombs hung up and returned them. The aborting A/C returned 38 bombs to base.


TRACK CHART





SUBJECT: A/C 7510 (Major Jerry W. Maupin & Capt. Ball) missing on 8 August 1944 mission to Hautmesnil.

TO : COMMANDING OFFICER, 401st Bomb Grp., (H), APO 557, Sta. 128, US Army.

1. Interrogation of crews who participated in this mission discloses that A/C 7510 was apparently lost to flak and was seen to hit the ground outside the eastern outskirts of the city of Caen, France. When this A/C was definitely observed to be going down, A/C 7628, commanded by Lt. Harry Piper, took over and led the Group (High Box of the 94th "B" CBW) back to base.

2. It appears that the High Box of the 94th "B" CBW passed over the assigned primary target at approximately 1526 hours on a northeasterly heading. The bomb bay doors of A/C 7510 were observed to open and then close with no bombs dropped. The assigned target was practically obscured by a combination of haze and smoke and dust resulting from explosions of bombs dropped by the seven (7) CBW which preceded the 94th "B" CBW into the target area.

3. When the bomb bay doors of A/C 7510 were closed, the A/C changed course; in the course of a minute or two, the A/C was engaged in what Lt. Piper thought to be some form of evasive action. The Wing Commander called once or twice to see if the High Box had unloaded its bombs, and no answer forthcoming from A/C 7510, the Deputy replied that they were still holding their bombs.

4. At about this time, the bomb bay doors of A/C 7510 again opened and bombs were dropped, the balance of the Group bombing also. A/C 7510 immediately began to lose altitude and the Group followed for a short distance, until A/C 7510, which was never observed definitely to have been hit, nosed down steeply. At this point, Lt. Piper took over the Lead. During all of this period over the target area, the Group was encountering meager to moderate flak of fair accuracy.

5. A/C 7510 nosed down very steeply, and an oxygen bottle or fire extinguisher was noticed to fall from the bomb bay, followed almost immediately by a crew-member. At least 3 crew-members came out the bomb bay, and two or three crews observed what appeared to be a fire in one corner of the bomb bay.

6. A/C 7510 leveled somewhat before penetrating the haze, and began describing what appeared to be a controlled, easy spiral. Although fire was observed in the bomb bay, no crews reported that the A/C was smoking on the way down. The A/C was not visibly afire when it hit the ground, although it was observed to slide and skid for some distance and burst into flame.

7. Further questioning of ten crews revealed the following count of chutes seen to emerge from the plane:

8. Two crew-members reported that one man who jumped from A/C 7510 either had no chute on, or lost it in trying to hook it up.

9. One other man who jumped from A/C 7510 was watched closely by two ball turret gunners who state that he was making a delayed jump and that they never did see his chute open.

10. General consensus of opinion is to the effect that all crew-members of A/C 7510 had sufficient time to escape from the plane.
