1. Assigned Target; SOEST, GERMANY

2. Commitments: The 401st was to furnish the complete 86 A/C 94th "C" CBW.

Two PFF A/C were included in the lead box and one PFF A/C in the high box. A spare was to accompany each formation.

3. Flight Over Target:

- a. Takeoff: Take off was under-near instrument conditions. There was a solid layer of clouds from the ground to 9000'. All ships took off satisfactorily.
- b. Group and Wing Assemblies: Assembly was good, made at 15000' which was briefed altitude plus five thousand feet.

 Due to the change in attitude assembly was not accomplished on time.
- c. Route Over England: We departed directly for point Z and made Division assembly on time and departed in good wing and division assembly.

MISSION SUMMARY REPORT (Cont)

4. Attack:

a. Flight to Target:

Flight to IP was as briefed. Control points were made on time. Position in Division was number three. Just after reaching the IP the wing went into a layer of clouds (on the advice of Buckeye Red) and near instrument conditions resulted until the Rhine River had almost been reached on the route out. PFF runs could not be made due to the shortness of the runs for the lead box. The high box and low box were lost from wing formation. The high box bombed PFF on the secondary in the vicinity of the low box salvoed bombs on an unknow target of opportunity to reduce weight and save gas. The lead box bombed Wesel with fair results. (Visual)

b. Bombing Run:

Lead Box:

Briefed data was fairly close. Cloud coverage was 9/10-10/10ths from just after the IP to the target. As the assigned primary target was to be bombed visually, no bombs could be dropped. In heading for the PFF secondary the "Mickey Operator" encountered difficulty, finally being unable to pick it up. Decision was made to find a target of opportunity, and a letdown was made to 21,000°. Undercast was about 5/10ths when the Mickey Operator picked up Wesel, Germany. The bombardier decided to make a run and was able to make a 30 second run. As this target seemed to be the last good target in the Ruhr district, it was though best to drop the bombs even if the run was short. The aiming point was the marshalling yards on the east side of the town. Heading was 156° and bombs were away at 1418. Results were unobserved because of violent evasive action after bombs were away.

Low Box:

At the IP the high box turned and uncovered behind the lead and we were too far in trail. The scouting force stated that the weather was good therefore we prepared for a visual bombing. After the turn at the IP the haze and contrails made pin-pointing impossible. We passed over the target without being able to made a run due to heavy haze and continued to the Secondary. The same conditions existed at the secondary and having but lost sight of the lead and high groups we could not drop on PFF. Not knowing when we would break out of the heavy haze, and flying through it for 30 minutes we dropped our bombs on an unknown target of opportunity before reaching the bomb line.

High Box:

The weather to the IP was mostly undercast. Part of the way there were broken clouds and one was and only to pick pin-points on occasions. As we came near the IP the clouds were broken and only haze was the only obstruction to our seeing the area clearly. Visual bombing was announced by the Wing commander, so we dropped back in trail. We were behind the lead group because the low was to bar behind. The lead group went past the IP and then made a turn in the general direction of the target. Shortly after heading in the direction of the target, we ran into weather.

MISSION SUMMARY REPORT (Cont)

b. Bombing Run: (Cont)

High Box: We passed the primary target, because we could hardly see our wing ships - much less the target. We lost the lead and low groups. The "Mickey" Operator picked up the secondary target we made a run. Wedropped PFF on the secondary target.

- c. Flight From Target:

 By individual groups, but pretty much as briefed for each box. As wing assembly was not attempted due to lack of gasoline and good fighter support. However, each box more or less followed the briefed course home.
- d. Return to Base: A diversion was received while over France sending the

 401st to North Pickenham: Twenty-four A/C landed there, and
 others at scattered fields.
- e. Weather: Over England 10/10ths bases 0, tops 9-10,000, 2/10-5/10ths middle 12000-13000', no high. Over continent 7-9/10ths low strata cumulus. 3/10-5/10ths high and middles in layers.
- f. Fighter Support: Godd.
- G. Conclusions and Recommendations:

 Buckeye Red must be able to make the proper decisions as regards weather and its effect on bomber formations.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Box:

Of the 12 A/C entering enemy territory, nine bombed on the selected target of opportunity, Wesel, Germany. They dropped 106 x 500# GP on Wesel. 3 A/C (#159, 485, & 146) had difficulty staying in formation and finally selected the last

resort target (Dulmen) and dropped 36 x 500# GP.

Low Box:

Thirteen A/C entered enemy territory. A/C 602 tacked on the 379th Gp and bombed the secondary target, Hamm, with them dropping 12 x 500# GP. The other twelve aircraft selected an unknown target of opportunity NW of Hamm and dropped 144 x 500 GP.

High Box: Twieve A/C entered enemy territory and bombed the secondary target,

Hamm. They droped 143 x 500# GP.

Mission to SOEST, GERMANY

19 September 1944

PRIMARY TARGET: The primary is the large Marshalling Yard at SOEST which can handle 4400 wagons per 24 hour period. Its primary importance at this time is that it is an important link in the system of supply of enemy forces opposing our airbourne operation in Holland. In addition to its present tactical importance, it is the main supplementary marshalling yard dealing with traffic to and from the Ruhr from central and eastern Germany.

SECONDARY TARGET: Secondary Target is the very large marshalling yards at Hamm,
Germany, which have a capacity of 10,000 wagons per day.

It is the largest yard in Germany dealing with general traffic and at present is another link in the supply system connected with German opposition to the abovementioned airborne operation.
