MISSION SUMMARY REPORT

MISSION # 161

Date 26 October 1944

ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: BIELFELD, GERMANY
2. Commitments: The 401st furnished three 12 A/C squadrons comprising the 94th "C" Group. One PFF A/C was included in each squadron and one spare accompanied each formation.

3. Flight Over England:

- a. Takoff: The group took off for assembly on Cottesmore buncher. As the lead ship taxied out the assembly altitude was changed from 14,000' to 20,000'. One A/C in the low squadron failed to take off and was replaced by the flying spare.
- b. Sqdn and Gp Assemblies: The assembly was excellent under the conditions of the increased altitude (20,000') which left barely enough time for all the ships to get in formation. The 94th "C" group departed slightly east of the buncher about 1 minute early with 37 ships in sight, 35 in good formation.

MISSION SUMMARY REPORT (C)3. Flight Over England: (Cont)

c. Route Over England: The route over England was as briefed except for altitude (20,000') which put us 6000' above 94th "A" and 4000' above 94th "B". Both 94th "A" and 94th "B" experienced difficulty with clouds because of low altitude on assembly and were late at CP #1. The group arrived at CP #1 in reverse order (C,B,A) and since 94th "C" was on time 94th "A" and 94th "B" cut in behind 94th "C", but shortly after leaving the CP #1 the division was in good column with 94th "C" about 2 minutes behind 94th "B".

4. Attack:

a. Flight to Target: Flight to target was about as briefed except that all groups climbed to bombing altitude over North Sea instead of going in 1,000' lower. Entered enemy territory with 36 ships in good formation over 10/10ths clouds. No opposition was encountered to target. Squadrons uncovered at IP for individual PFF runs. Squadron's smoke bombs were concentrated over target as there was no flak.

b. Bombing Run:

Lead Squadron: The turn on the IP was made as briefed. The bombing run was made with Mickey due to 10/10ths undercast. AFCE was used on run with no malfunction apparent nor was there any interference on the bomb run. The Mickey Operator aimed for the center of the town which was about 11,000' short of the assigned MPI; The telescope indice was set in motion and checked with the Mickey man. Just before the indices met, the telescope indice was quickly rolled back .44 units of tangency and then allowed to continue on again. Thus, the bomb was done PFF with the aid of the Bombardier's computer grid. The Leader's bombs were salvoed through sight as indices met. The balance of the formation dropped with a 140' intervalometer setting. Results were unobserved.

Low Squadron: We received a call from the Group Air Commander to make the bomb run PFF because of the solid undercast. We turned on the IP and opened the bomb bay doors. The bombardier clutched in when the Mickey man called out 70°. Mickey synchronized on the center of the town. Just before the indices met the telescope indices was moved back .44 units of tangency placing the bombs on the assigned MPI, which was 11,000' over the center of the city where the Mickey Operator was aiming. When the indices met the leader salvoed and the balance of the formation dropped their bombs using a 140' intervalometer setting. AFCE functioned properly. Results were unobserved.

MISSION SUMMARY REPORT (Cont.)b. Bombing Run: (cont)

High Squadron: Due to 10/10ths cloud cover the bombing was done PFF. The Mickey Operator brought us in on course and since the target was too small an object to pick up, he aimed at the center of the town, which was directly on course and about 11,000' short of the assigned MPI. With the aid of the Bombarider's Computer Grid the Bombardier delayed the bomb release for about 34 seconds and therefore threw the bombs at the target while the Mickey man was aiming at the city. The AFCE was working efficiently. The bombs were salvoed by the leader and dropped with a 140' intervalometer setting by all others. Results were 'neath the clouds.

c. Flight From Target: The high squadron of 94th "C" became separated from the group on bomb run and withdrew with another group approximately 5 minutes behind 94th "C". 94th "C" came out in proper position in division column, encountering no flak opposition altho some meager flak was shot at 94th "B" & "A". Let down was made over the channel, the group flying a more direct course home than briefed.

d. Return to Base: The lead and low Squadrons of the 94th "C" came back to base together. The two squadrons let down thru a break to 1,000' about 20 minutes East of field and came in for a normal landing. The high squadron made an instrument let down on Cottesmore buncher and came in by individual ships. There were no losses or casualties.

e. Weather: Weather was described as 10/10ths undercast over channel and continent, consisting of alto-cumulus clouds with tops at 12,000' or 15,000' altitude, only one small break observed south of the target area. No contrails over target.

f. Fighter Support: Fighter support was excellent.

g. Comments on Formation: The formation was very good and the proper interval maintained on flight to target. The high squadron dropped back on bomb run to be sure not to overrun preceding squadron; the low squadron was in close to the lead over the target.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations: The practice of having one B-17 group scatter chaff ahead of all groups over a target area seemed to work very well today as flak was not encountered.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking: All scheduled aircraft attacked.

6. Enemy Opposition: No air opposition was seen nor encountered. Also no flak was encountered. (see Flak Report)

7. Battle Damage: None.

8. Sasualties: None.
9. Statistical Summary of Operations: (see attached form)
10. Bombing Data:
- a. Observations: Due to complete undercast results were unobserved. Good "mickey" work indicated a probability of good results.
- b. Disposition of Bombs:
- Lead Squadron: All of the 12 A/C E.E.T. attacked the target dropping 72 IB's and 71 GP'S. The spare A/C returned 6 IB's and 6 GP's.
- Low Squadron: All of the 12 A/C E.E.T. attacked the target dropping 72 IB's and 71 GP's. The spare had originally filled in for 1 aircraft not taking off - hence there were 12 A/C Taking off and 12 A/C bombing.
- High Squadron: All of the 12 A/C E.E.T. attacked the target dropping 72 IB's and 71 GP's. The spare returned 6 IB's and 6 GP's.







TO : Commanding Officer, Station 128, APO 557, U.S. Army. (Thru Lt. Col. William T. Seawell).

1. Lt. Jack P. Comer, Pilot A/C 8541, who was flying No. 2 position in Low section of Lead Squadron reported that A/C 8159 (Oas) got out of formation on the bomb run and flew directly over A/C 8541, which had to move out of position in order to avoid being hit by bomb.
2. Lt. Paul J. Sullivan, Pilot A/C 7113 states that members of 614th Squadron crew #2 have piled into 615th Squadron trucks several times after breakfast.
3. Lt. Herbert L. Oas, Jr., Pilot A/C 8159 reported that SOP air speeds were not followed in climbing and upon letting down, and were not constant.
4. Lt. George S. Schaunaman, Pilot A/C 6506, who was flying deputy to Major McGree, reported that A/C 7113 (Sullivan) continually flew too close.
5. Lt. Lawrence E. Lowry, Navigator A/C 7551 (flying in High Squadron) reported that the formation flew too slow; consequently, his pilot was continually essing and he could not get correct drift readings.
6. Lt. Eugene E. Hoemann, Co-Pilot A/C 7602 stated that the High Squadron formation was excellent.
7. Lt. Edwin H. Spuhler, Pilot A/C 8738 praised navigation done by High Squadron Leader.
8. The crew of Lt. Francis E. Rundell, Pilot A/C 2468 were pleased with the excellent cookies in their lunch and suggest a larger supply be provided.

1. The following aircraft aborted from the mission of
25 October 1944:

a. A/C # 42-31891 - Returned early because pilot could not get supercharger boost on # 3 engine. Ground inspection revealed that a rubber connector sleeve connecting two segments of the # 3 supercharger air pressure duct had worked loose because the lower collar holding the sleeve to the lower segment had slipped. This caused a loss of supercharger boost to # 3 engine. Pilot said that he could not maintain position in formation and climb to bombing altitude with a setting of 38" Hg. and 2300 RPM on engines 1, 2 and 4. The # 3 engine had a power setting of 19" Hg. at 20,000 ft. with no more boost obtainable and he could expect a drop in manifold pressure of slightly less than one (1) inch for every thousand feet higher to bombing altitude. The supercharger air pressure duct had been modified according to T.M.I. O1-20E-30.
