DAYMISSION SUMMARY REPORTMISSION # 176DATE 4 December 1944ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: KASSEL, GERMANY
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished three 12 A/C squadrons for the 94th "A" Group. Two PFF A/C were included in the Lead Squadrons and a spare accompanied each formation.

3. Flight Over England:

a. Takeoff:

Takeoff time was set back one hour just prior to original takeoff time for lead ships. The lead A/C of the low box had to be changed at the last moment, and as a consequence the leader never did catch the formation. The deputy took over for the low squadron.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)3. b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

Assembly was as briefed at 11,000 feet for the lead squadron. The wind was better than 60 knots at assembly altitude which necessitated an extremely long upward leg on the assembly pattern to keep from drifting east of the buncher. The group departed the buncher one minute early in good formation.

c. Route Over England:

94th "B" and 94th "C" joined 94th "A" to make a very good wing formation on the last leg prior to reaching C P 1. The route over England was as briefed. Near 52° 15' N the wing had to alter its course to avoid running into a 3rd Division group which had drifted east of its buncher while assembling. The group departed C P 1 one half minute late on course. Division assembly was made over the Channel. Our position was the 3rd group in the "A" task force. The second group (Foxhole Baker) did not get into the column until over the continent and never closed up on the Division lead group.

4. Attack:a. Flight to Target:

94th "A" was 3rd in the division until after the town southeast of Coblenz. The Group ahead of 94th "A" turned late and was caught in an envelope of flak. 94th "A" went a little off course and to the right to avoid this flak. By flying in a northwesternly direction with better than a 40° drift the lead navigator made good his IP.

b. Bombing Run:

Several minutes before the IP Buckeye Red informed us that target was completely covered. We swung a little past the briefed IP because of the congestion there and then into target on a Mag. Heading of 96° with the Mickey operator making all necessary corrections.

The telescope was clutched in when he called out 70° and but one slight correction was made after that. Drift and rate were killed about 30 seconds before bombs away indicating a good run. As the indices met bombs were salvoed, results being unobserved. Bomb run was made on AFCE, in Group formation. Low and High Squadron leaders also salvoed, all others used a 140 foot intervalometer setting.

c. Flight from Target:

After the target the division column closed up with two groups of a task force stacked at the two briefed altitudes. The time interval between the first and last groups did not exceed 4 minutes, notwithstanding the low ground speed of 54 knots which was being made while flying into the wind. Northwest of Fulda the 2nd Division joined the column at a lower altitude. North of Frankfurt the 3rd Division came into the column and the division stayed together until crossing over into friendly territory. The bombing altitude of 25,000' was maintained passing south of Coblenz.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)

4. d. Return to Base:

Near Brussels, cycle relay advised all groups to proceed directly to their respective bases and not to use the stand off procedure. 94th "A" was 47 minutes late at C. P. 4 because of the unexpectedly high winds. A letdown was made by the formation off the Belgian coast and the group proceeded directly to the base at an altitude of 15,000', all ships landed safely.

e. Weather:

Weather was described as 1/10's to Coblenz and increasing to 10/10 over target area. No contrails were present. The weather upon return was about the same.

f. Fighter Support:

Fighter support was good.

g. Comments on Formation:

Very good group formation. The division formation from the target to C. P. 4 was excellent.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

None.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

Low Squadron:

A/C 43-38077 - Not Sortie. After changing A/C at the last moment pilot failed to reach formation.

6. Enemy Opposition:

No air opposition was seen or encountered, Flak encountered at target consisted of about 12 bursts, good for altitude but to left of formation.

10. Bombing Data:

a. Observations:

Due to complete undercast, results were unobserved.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)10. b. Disposition of Bombs:Lead Squadron:

All 12 A/C E.E.T. attacked the secondary target, dropping 118 X 500# M64 and 24 X 500# M17 bombs. The spare returned 10 GP's and 2 IB's to base.

Low Squadron:

Of the 12 A/C E.E.T., nine attacked the secondary target, dropping 90 X 500# M64 and 18 X 500# M17 bombs. Two A/C joined other groups -- A/C 7602 bombed with the 379th Group and attacked Soest with 10 GP's and 2 IB's. A/C 7478 bombed with the 384th Group and attacked Soest with 10 GP's and 2 IB's. A/C 2659 encountered engine trouble and bombed an unknown T. of O. at 5019-0750 E with 10 GP's and 2 IB's. Aborting A/C 8077 returned 10 GP's and 2 IB's to base.

High Squadron:

Of the 12 A/C E.E.T., eleven bombed the secondary target. A/C 7931 encountered engine trouble and bombed an unknown T. of O. at 5120-0820 E. The spare returned 10 GP's and 2 IB's to base.





1. Lt. Robert L. Long, Pilot A/C 8637, complimented the excellent timing on the mission and stated that Group formation was excellent.
 2. Lt. Frank G. Mitchell, CP A/C 2393, reported that formation scattered badly immediately after bombs away.
 3. Lt. Julian Roadman, Pilot A/C 6992, reported that BTG in A/C 733 (Lt. Aiken) did not get into the ball until A/C had reached 0740E. He stated that BT guns in this A/C pointed straight down until that point was reached.
 4. The crew of Lt. Charles W. Hopley is living in a barracks with no stove, and although they have tried numerous times to get one, none has ever been provided.
 5. The crew of Lt. Ray A. Baker, Pilot A/C 8077, report that no transportation ever showed up at dispersal area #31, and they had to walk in to interrogation.
 6. The crew of Lt. Glenn H. St. Aubyn, pilot A/C 508, flew a ground spare and reported that it was in excellent condition.
 7. The crew of Lt. Jack P. Comer, pilot A/C 8541, would like hot chocolate at interrogation in place of coffee.
