Date 6 December 1944ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: MERSEBURG, GERMANY
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished the 94th "A" Group for Division Lead, together with 94th "C" Squadron which operated as a Screening Force. Two PFF A/C were included in the lead squadron, one in each of the other two squadrons and also ^{2 PFF} the Screening Force. A spare accompanied each formation.

MISSION SUMMARY REPORT (Cont)3. Flight Over England:a. Takeoff:

Takeoff was normal and without incident. One aircraft in the low box failed to take off.

b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

Squadron and Group assemblies over the Cottesmore buncher were very good and the formation departed the buncher on time and on course.

c. Route Over England:

All control points over England were made as briefed and the formation headed for Clacton. As the coast was departed on course the Division seemed to be falling in behind in a satisfactory fashion. One 3rd Division Group (Square P) flew through the formation before CP #1 for no apparent reason and caused part of formation to get into prop-wash, however, group left coast as briefed.

4. Attack:a. Flight to Target:

The flight to the target was as briefed, no unusual circumstances were experienced. Visual contact was maintained with the following two groups. The 41st CBW caught up after being behind for awhile. East of Hannover the weather became 10/10ths hence a PFF run was set up.

b. Bombing Run:

Going into the target it was evident that the pathfinder technique would be used to drop the bombs. The turn into the target from the IP was as briefed with the squadrons staying in group formation. The Mickey Operator was getting excellent returns from the target. The data in the bombsight checked all the way down the bomb run with the Mickey readings. Bombs were salvoed as indices met at 1152. The leads of the other two squadrons salvoed on group lead with the balance of the formation dropping with 50' intervalometer setting. The run was made using the C-1 pilot. No interference was experienced.

c. Flight From Target:

The turn from the target was as briefed and the Division continued out in normal fashion. No flak was encountered other than in the target area. Letdown was started over Holland and Cromer was passed at the briefed 2000' altitude.

d. Return to Base:

Formations proceeded to base, arriving a little late because of strong winds encountered over the channel. All ships landed safely with no casualties.

4. e. Weather:

Weather was described as 8/10ths low undercast until Hannover area was reached, becoming 10/10ths undercast east of Hannover and in target area.

f. Fighter Support:

Fighter Support was excellent.

g. Comments on Formation:

Formation was generally good, and interval behind division lead seemed to be as briefed.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

Information received from "Buckey Blue" and "Red" was correct and helpful. The H2X equipment in all PFF A/C and Screening Force operated satisfactorily.

i. Screening Force:

94th "C" Squadron Screening Force flew the exact briefed route, opened formation and discharged chaff as briefed at the extreme edge of the envelope of fire at the target area. Crews observed that chaff seemed to be effective, and screening force tacked on Division column as briefed and proceeded to base without incident.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

Low Squadron: A/C 42-106992 - Not Sortie. Returned early due to external supply line to prop governor being broken.

High Squadron: A/C 42-31485 - Not Sortie. Returned early when pilot claimed #4 manifold pressure was lagging. Flight check revealed no malfunction.

MISSION SUMMARY REPORT (Cont.)10. Bombing Data:a. Observations:

Due to complete undercast, results were unobserved. A good PFF run was made and results are thought to be good.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron: Of the 12 scheduled A/C E.E.T., eleven bombed the secondary target, dropping 218 X 250# M57 bombs. A/C 6132 encountering release trouble attacked an unknown target of opportunity at 5123-1150E. The spare returned 20 bombs to base.

Low Squadron: Of the 12 scheduled A/C eleven penetrated enemy territory and dropped 416 X M1A1 Frags on the secondary. Aborting A/C 992 returned 24 bombs to base.

High Squadron: Of the 12 scheduled A/C eleven penetrated enemy territory attacking the secondary with 219 X 250# M57 bombs. Aborting A/C 485 jettisoned 20 bombs in the channel. The spare returned 12 bombs to base.

Screening Force: Of the 12 A/C E.E.T. all dropped the briefed amount of chaff on target. The spare returned to base with its load.





SUBJECT: Crew Complaints and Suggestions.

TO : Commanding Officer, Station 120, APO 557, U.S. Army.

1. Most all crews were of the opinion that the mission was very well led and that navigation could not have been better.

2. Generally, because of the fact that there were 40 crews to be transported to the briefing room upon return from mission, there were numerous complaints concerning crews who had to wait for trucks. Also for this reason, interrogation proceeded slowly.

3. A large number of crews, when advised that they would be expected to attend a P/W lecture at 2000 hours, voiced an unfavorable reaction (this lecture was called off however).

4. The crew of Lt. Herman Tausig, Pilot A/C 8113, suggests that at least one flight surgeon remain at the briefing room until all crews have reported for interrogation.

5. More complaints were made concerning crowded latrines in the briefing room and the general unsanitary atmosphere created when approximately 500 men used this small latrine in a very short space of time.

6. The crew of Lt. Louis E. Cooper, Pilot A/C 8810, say they are not given enough food to be taken on missions.

7. Lt. Julian Roadsman, Pilot A/C 7050, stated that the low section, low squadron was in poor formation most of the day.

8. Lt. Col. Burton K. Voorhees, Division Leader, reported that a third Division group (insignia square-P) flew through the 94th "A" group formation prior to control point one, so close that a portion of 94th "A" Group was caught in prop wash of the third division group.

WEATHER INTERROGATION SUMMARY FOR MISSION ON 6 DECEMBER 1944.

BASE AT TAKE OFF: 0749. No low cloud. 6/10 cirrus at 20,000 ft. Visibility 3000 yds in haze.

ROUTE OUT: No low cloud becoming 5-8/10 stratocumulus and building cumulus tops 6-10,000 ft over the Channel, breaking to 3-5/10 stratocumulus over the Continental Coast, becoming covered by middle cloud over the Continent. 0-2/10 altostratus base 13-15,000 ft over England becoming nil over Channel increasing to 2-4/10 altocumulus and altostratus tops 10-12,000 ft over the Continental Coast becoming 7-9/10 at 6 degrees E and breaking to 4-5/10 near 10 degrees E and then increasing again to 8-10/10 altocumulus and altostratus tops 16-18,000 ft East of 11 degrees E. 4-6/10 cirrus base 20,000 ft over England breaking to nil to 2/10 over the Channel and to nil over the Continent. Visibility unrestricted becoming restricted in the Target area.

TARGET: 1152. 9-10/10 altocumulus and altostratus tops 18,000 ft. Visibility restricted by haze.

ROUTE BACK: Similar to route out except over England. 7-10/10 altostratus tops 15-16,000 ft base 8-9,000 ft. with 4-6/10 stratocumulus base 2-3000 ft tops 6-8,000 ft in the Eastern districts of England becoming 5-8/10 stratocumulus base 800-1000 ft with rain in the Base Area. Visibility unrestricted except over England.

BASE ON RETURN: 1537. 7/10 stratocumulus base 800 - 1000 ft. 10/10 altostratus base 6-8,000 ft. Visibility 2 miles in haze and rain.

REMARKS: Winds were 10-20 knts. lighter than forecast to about 8deg E. the forecast winds were good in the target area. Direction forecast good. Temperatures were 2-3 degrees warmer than forecast. Light to moderate non-persistent contrails above 22-24,000 ft.

SUBJECT: Abortive Report

TO : Commanding Officer, 401st Bomb Group (H), AAF Station 128
ATTN: Air Statistical Officer

1. The following aircraft aborted from the mission of 5 December 1944, for the reasons stated:

a. A/C # 44-6506 - Returned early due to a combination of troubles experienced on # 1, 2 and 4 engines. The airplane had been airborne about 2-1/2 hours and was at altitude of 20,500 feet when the pilot turned back. The # 1 engine ran rough and smoked all the way to altitude at power settings varying from 36" Hg to 38" Hg. Pilot said that no mixture control position would correct trouble. The # 2 propeller could not be controlled by the prop governor controls. The RPM's would go to 2550 RPM and no manipulating of prop governor controls would control the RPM. The # 4 engine ran hot. The cylinder head temperature ran to 250°. Opening cowl flaps cooled it to 100°. The RPM fluctuated steadily either side of RPM setting of 2300 RPM. Flight check revealed that # 2 propeller governor operation was faulty. This is a mechanical abort.

b. A/C # 43-37602 - Returned early after 2 hours in the air because the # 1 engine failed. At time trouble was noticed, the airplane was at 21,000 feet. The pilot had used 2400 RPM and 40" Hg for 40 minutes in order to climb satisfactorily. Pilot claimed ship was sluggish at power setting of 38" Hg and 2300 RPM. He climbed 300 feet per minute at 140 I.A.S. He was operating outboard engines in emergency rich because they were running hot. A ground check revealed fine metal particles on cuno, however, the magnetic sump plug was clean. This is a mechanical failure.
