Date 7 January 1945

ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: BITBURG, GERMANY
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished the complete 36 A/C 94th "C" Group. Three PFF were scheduled, one for each squadron. A spare accompanied each box.

3. Flight Over England:
  - a. Takeoff:

Takeoff was as briefed. The ceiling was less than 2,000 feet with 10/10ths coverage. The tops of the clouds were between 11,000 and 12,000. All ships picked up considerable clear ice on the climb to Cottesmore buncher.

3. b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

The lead squadron assembled at 16,000 feet. The group was formed prior to the last circle around the buncher, with the formation being rather loose. This was probably due to the full gas load and 9,000 pound bomb load which the ships were carrying plus the large amount of ice which was picked up enroute to the buncher.

c. Route Over England:

94th "C" departed the buncher a little south of Point "Y" and on time. Wing assembly was completed on the second ~~lx~~ leg, near the Wash. The groups followed 94th "B" by less than one half minute and turned on the inside of 94th "B" at C.P. 1 since 94th "B" was running 2 minutes late. 94th "C" crossed C. P. 1 to the left of 94th "B" and 1 minute late. "Cowboy Able", the 4th group in the division column, was on time and was crowding 94th "B"; which did not leave a sufficient interval for 94th "C" to follow 94th "B" across C. P. 1.

4. Attack:

a. Flight to Target:

The briefed route was followed. 94th "C" fell in behind 94th "B" midway across the channel after doing two shallow double drifts to the left at the IP, 94th "B" started its GH run and started a turn in a northerly direction evidently in an attempt to get back on the GH course. As a result 94th "C" turned sharply to the left, flew about 20 seconds and then did a 180° to the right, which heading was followed until the navigator got back on the Gee curve he was to follow in to the target. 94th "B" crossed in front of 94th "C" at bombs away, the former group releasing its bombs approximately 45 seconds ahead of 94th "C".

b. Bombing Run:

The cloud cover at the IP and all the way down the run was a solid undercast so the group attacked the primary blind. The lead squadron had no GH ship so the group bombed with the Gee box and in conjunction with the smoke markers of the two preceding groups. This had been decided before takeoff. 94th "C" swung about 2 miles south of the IP in order to reach a G line that was going to be followed in from that point right into the target. As the formation headed East, on the bomb run, a formation on the right gradually pushed 94th "C" to the north so 94th "C" turned directly north, flew that way for a minute, then did a 180° turn and came south till it hit the original Gee line and then went east again. That gave the other group time to get ahead and the group had a straight smooth run from there on in. The Gee line was used for course and the rate was killed by check points previously picked and measured. The bombardier checked the rate points called off by the navigator and the travel of the incix checked very well. This was quite similar to the PF<sub>2</sub> system that is used. The smoke markers of the preceding groups were crossed just about at the release point, so the bombs were salvoed by the group lead when the indices met. Bombing was done in group formation. The High and Low squadrons leaders salvoed on the leader's bombs. All others used a 50 ft. intervalometer setting. The AFCE was ok. Results were unobserved.

4. c. Flight from Target:

The briefed route was followed. After bombs away the group let do wn to 22,500 feet to get under a shelf of high clouds. Cycle relay advised all bomber groups to stay above 17,000 feet until reaching England, which 94th "C" did.

d. Return to Base:

After crossing the English Coast a large break was observed in the vicinity of the wash area and the group let down to 2,000 feet before it was broken up into squadrons, with the low and high squadrons proceeding to their respective stand off points, and ships landed safely at home base.

e. Weather:

Weather was described as 9/10 to 30 miles inside Belgian Coast, tops to 14-15,000 feet, becoming solid over target area.

f. Fighter Support:

Fighter support was good.

g. Comments on Formation:

Good to excellent, the latter existing on the bomb run.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

None.

10. a. Observations:

Due to solid undercast results were unobserved. From all indications the run was highly successful -- all navigation devices including PFF equipment and gee boxes of all aircraft in this group show that the target area was well hit.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the primary target, dropping 142 X 500# RDX bombs. The spare returned 12 RDX bombs to base -- 1 bomb was held up in A/C 1730 and jettisoned.

Low Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the primary target, dropping 119 RDX and 24 GP bombs on the target. The spare returned 12 RDX bombs to base.

High Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the primary target dropping 131 RDX and 12 GP bombs on the target. The spare returned 12 RDX bombs to base.

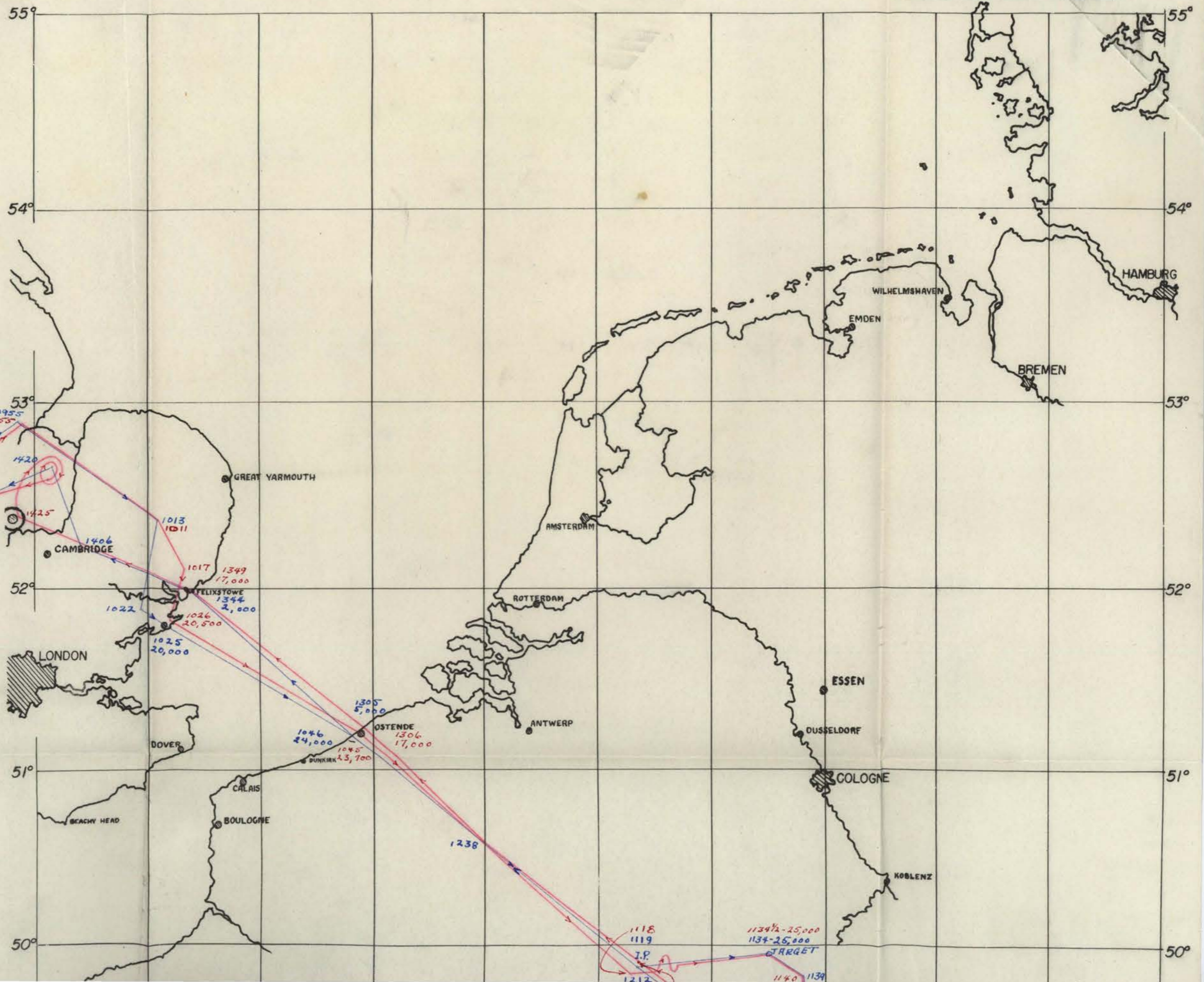

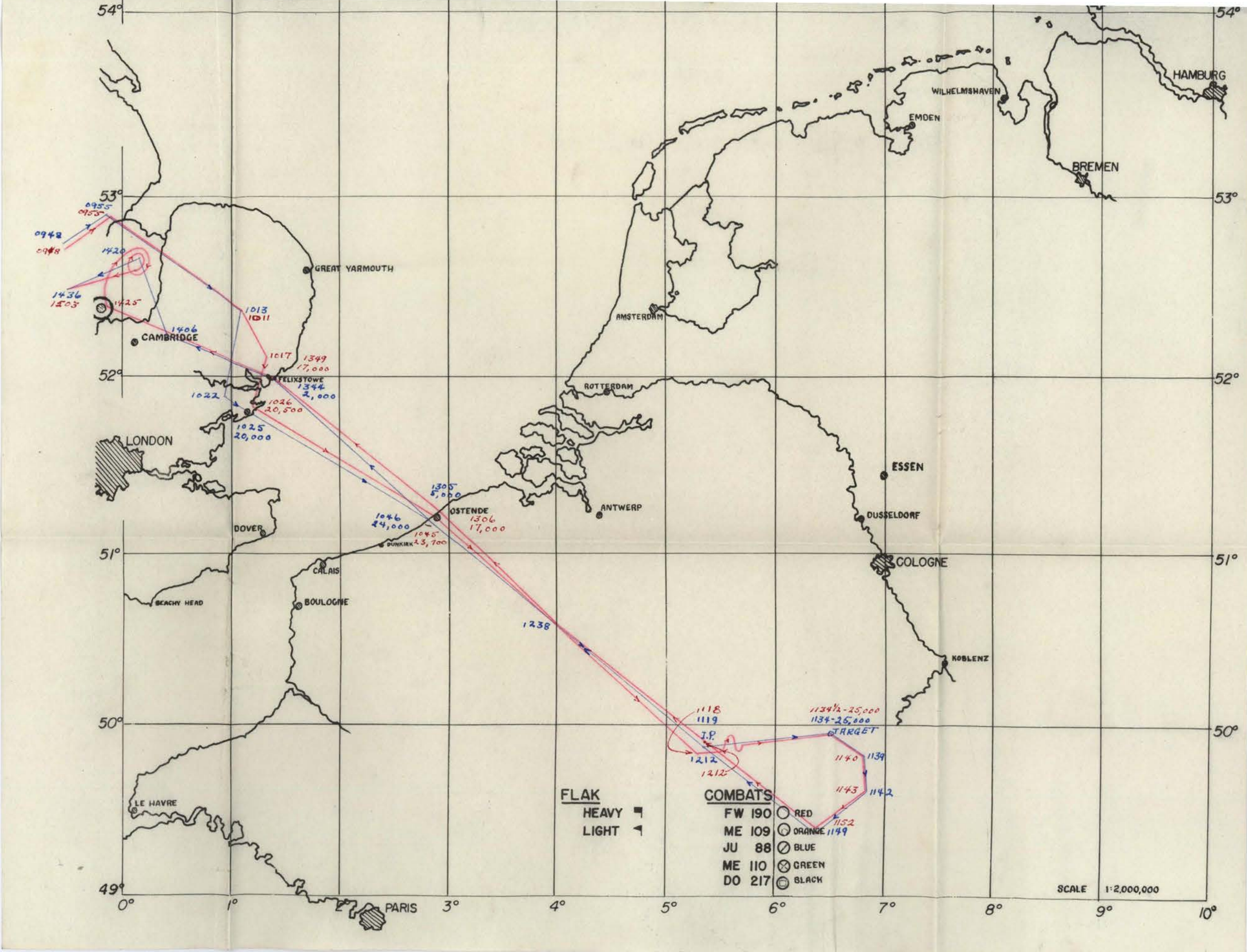

SUBJECT: Crew Comments and Suggestions.

TO : Commanding Officer, Station 128, APO 887, U.S. Army.

1. Because of the fact that the entire mission was considered to be highly successful, and no flak or fighters were encountered, a complete, detailed interrogation was not held.

2. The consensus of opinion of all crew members, however, was that the navigation throughout the entire mission, both during the assembly and over the continent, was extremely praiseworthy. A large number of the newer crew members characterized the leadership and navigation as the best they have ever seen.

3. A composite of fixes taken by all Navigators of this group, at the moment of bombs away, would seem to indicate that the primary target was either hit squarely, even in face of the solid undercast, or that, in the event the actual MPI was missed, no navigational devices would allow anyone to so state.

4. Several crew members observed that, when they went to the mess hall this morning, the mess hall had apparently not been notified of breakfast time; consequently, a large number of crew members were unable to eat a full breakfast and make briefing.

1. S/Egt. Duane F. Seeley, Toggelier in A/C 2012, made the following explanation at interrogation of the fact that nine bombs carried by this A/C were dropped early at (5015-0620E) (See fix):

a. The salvo lever could not be forced into the "select" position; the sleeve had not yet been turned. He was still trying to get the lever past the notch when the radio operator reported over the interphone that only 3 bombs remained in the rack.

2. Capt. H. S. Arnold, who interrogated S/Egt. Seeley, believes that the sleeve must have been in the "salvo" position. Capt. Arnold states that if this were the case, it was quite feasible that nine of the bombs might have dropped and three remained in the rack as reported.

3. No further comments were picked up by interrogators, with the exception of the fact that several waist gunners in the 612th Squadron report that waist windows have recently been so dirty that it is very difficult to see out of them.
