ASSIGNMENT

1. Assigned Target: FURSTENFELDBRUCK, GERMANY (A/F)
2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished the complete 36 A/C 94th "A" Group, Division and Air Force lead. Two PFF were included in the lead squadron, one PFF in the low, and a PFF-GH A/C in the high squadron. A spare accompanied the lead and high squadrons.

3. Flight Over England:

a. Takeoff:

After a total delay of 2:45 take-off was made without incident.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)

3. b. Squadron and Group Assemblies:

Assembly at 5,000 feet was accomplished unusually fast. Complete formation left Cottesmore buncher 1/2 minute late on course.

c. Route Over England:

No difficulty was encountered in Wing assembly. Points "A", "D", and "E" were made on time. At "F" the group was two minutes early so a wide turn was executed and Dungeness departed on time. At point "F" Division leader could see the 41st CBW coming in from the Beachy Head Area. The 40th CBW was not airborne so the 1st CBW moved up into third Wing position.

4. Attack:

a. Flight to Target:

Flight to Control Point # 2 was as briefed. Some middle cloud (0-3/10) at approximately 17,000 feet was encountered at 5° E but no difficulty resulted. After C P # 2 the 94th CBW group made a double drift to enable the 41st CBW to close the interval. The formation was north of course at 10° E but the IP was made good. Buckeye Blue had announced that all targets were open, nil cloud except an overcast at 26,500 feet; the leader passed the message back along the column. Also that north of the target cloud went down to 24,000 feet. The leader talked some to the pilots on the bomb run and they held excellent position. Bombing results for the group were excellent.

b. Bombing Run:

"Buckeye" called that bombing would be visual. The IP was easily identified some distance out; upon reaching the IP the group uncovered for the bomb run. The MPI was picked out about four minutes prior to "bombs away". Synchronization was easy as most of the data was pre-set. Bombs were away at 1705 on a Mag. heading of 96°. Results were observed to be excellent for all squadrons. The C-1 was used satisfactorily by all squadrons.

Mission Summary Report (Cont'd)

4. c. Flight from Target:

Descent was made after the target to 20,000 feet. High cloud at 22,000 was encountered at the turning point after the target but no difficulty resulted. The remaining flight was as briefed and without difficulty.

d. Return to Base:

Since the 401st was the lead group and no interference would result the group returned direct to base after clearing London. All ships landed safely at home base.

e. Weather:

Generally CAVU enroute with some 3/10 middle cloud at 5° E for short period only. CAVU over target with some high clouds at 24,000 ft. just after coming off target. Slight ground haze encountered on route back at continental coast.

f. Fighter Support:

Good.

g. Comments on Formation and Interval:

Squadron formations were consistantly good. High and Low trailed one formation length until Dungsess and then closed up. The low trailed one length during part of the climb but immediately closed up again. Interval of units foolwing in the wing appeared good.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

Mission very successful. Believe group proved that compact bombing patterns can be accomplished with mixed GP & IB load and intervalmeter setting if pilots fly correctly.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

A/C 43-31891 - No credit. Nos. 1, 2, and 4 generators burned out. Two batteries ruined due to too high voltage output set on generators. Believe abortive caused by setting voltage output too high. (Personnel)

No enemy air opposition seen or encountered. (see Flak Report for Flak)

10. Bombing Data:

a. Observations:

All squadrons hit assigned MPI in excellent fashion. Strike photos show good patterns with 95-100% of hits within 1000 ft. of assigned MPI.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron:

Of the 12 A/C sorties, eleven attacked the target, dropping 12 X 500# GP, 54 X 500# RDX, and 44 X 500# IB bombs. A/C 891 aborted and returned 6 RDX's and 4 IB's to base. The spare returned 6 RDX's and 4 IB's.

Low Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the target, dropping 67 X 500# RDX and 43 X 500# IB bombs. A/C 322 experiencing release troubles had 1 RDX released at the IP and 1 IB released one minute before target. A/C 602 also experienced release troubles, for after releasing 2 RDX's on the target it returned 4 RDX and 4 IB to base.

High Squadron:

All 12 scheduled A/C attacked the target dropping 72 X 500# RDX and 48 X 500# IB bombs. The spare returned 6 RDX's and 6 IB's †
